## **Colombia Receives Bids for Mountain Highways Advisory Contracts**

Colombia's national infrastructure agency ANI has received offers for two advisory contracts relating to the Autopistas para la Prosperidad PPP programme, a four-part COP13tn (USD7.22bn) project to build 1,160km of new highways.

Bids were received last week and the contract is expected to be awarded next week.



## **Two Advisory Contracts**

The first contract, worth COP1.06bn (USD588,000), calls for an advisor to conduct financial modeling, risk assessment and project promotion for the four PPPs. The following five bidding groups submitted offers:

- Estructuración Autopistas para la Prosperidad: Estructuras en Finanzas, AFH Consultores Asociados);
- PwC Corporate Finance;
- Financiera Prosperidad 2012: Inverling, Structur Banca de Inversión, Grupo de Gestión y Tecnología;
- Bonus Banca de Inversión;
- Consultoría Inversiones y Proyectos (CIP), together with law firm Durán y Osorio Asociados.

The second contract, which is estimated to be worth COP9.59bn (USD5.32m), calls for a firm to conduct additional engineering studies to reduce the risks of the first and second sections of the highway project. The following teams are bidding for this contract:

- Consorcio T&C: Técnica y Proyectos (TYPSA), Consultores Regionales Asociados
- Ginprosa Ingeniería

## **Procurement Timeline**

ANI plans to begin procuring the first section of the Autopistas para la Prosperidad in December and potentially award the concession contracts between June and November of next year.

Section 1 will run 221km from Medellín to El Tigre and cost an estimated COP4.27tn (USD2.37bn). Section 2 will run 170km from Porcesito to Caucasia and cost COP4.35tn (USD2.42bn). Section 3 will run 345km from San José del Nus to the existing Ruta del Sol and cost COP717bn (USD398m). Section 4 will run 424km from Tres Puertas to Camilo C. Restrepo and cost COP3.7tn (USD2.06bn).
